Dear Sir:

As per your request, here are the terms on the Quo Vadis mine, Las Vegas, Nevada. The following is a fair description of the mine:

It is situated about twenty-two miles Southeast of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, six miles to the south of the Boulder Dam Highway.

Consists of 10 claims,-- five claims the Santa Cruz, Eagle, Golden Septer, Quail and Leader under a three year lease with option to purchase. Royalties, 10% on \$50.00 ore, 15% on \$75.00 ore, 20% on \$100.00 and 25% on all ores in excess of \$100.00. An option price of \$50,000 to be exercised at any time during the life of lease.

Formation:- Of old origin principally neice, monzonite and cyanite with one or two ribs of (probably) baysite.

A large dyke of 60 feet in width runs for 4500 feet the entire length of three of these claims. Numerous cross fractures (carrying high grade gold values) terminate in the big dyke creating a sheared zone.

Development. Most of the work has been done on one of the cross fractures. A probable 700 feet of drift and tunnel work here has determined three independent shoots, enriched ore occurring in these shoots have been the object and incentive of all work done. Ore running into the thousands per ton have been taken from these workings in several different places in the past 30 years. While the total production is not attainable it is generally understood much more money has been taken out than the cost of entire development work on this ground.

The main dyke which shows much strength in size and mineralization (and probably the logical place to look for the real mine) has not (with the exception of two 25 feet holes been prospected-- this dyke is made up of probably 15% quartz, the country rock between these quartz stringers is strongly oxidized, much spar, calsite, a florine crystal quartz and manganese with small gold values, vanitate of lead, galena and small copper stain.

Other five claims, Big Horn, Treasure Vault, Treasure Vault No. 1, Quo Vadis and Quo Vadis Extension are owned by myself and partner. Are in the old formation and while not extensively

prospected, show some values.

After five months of work on this property I am of the opinion that with a small working capital, applied to a certain program of development, will put this property on production.

Most of the merchants who have done business in Vegas for the last twenty years or more, know of, and will support and boost a development of this ground. They, like I, believe it has merit.
