

1892 The Genoa "Courier" says that a new placer discovery has been made near Signal Mountain, northwest of Pine Nut district. 28 placer locations have recently been filed with the County recorder. The locators are principally Carson people.

1895 2/23 ^{Mt. House} Pine Nut District. According to our Nevada exchanges, the San Francisco parties who became interested in the Zirn & Schultz ~~mine~~ claims will commence the erection of a mill in May and have agreed to have it completed and running by August 1st. The mill will crush from 20 to 40 tons of ore per day, according to the character of the rock. These parties, it is said, have also agreed to procure a supply of water for the camp. The water will have to be piped a distance of 5 miles. All this will cost about \$10,000. The company will put men to work opening up the claims.

1894-9/29 Zirn & Schultz Mine: A pocket of extraordinarily rich gold ore reported in this mine in the Pine Nut district has caused much excitement in Carson and vicinity, and many people are reported flocking to the district.

0/1895 Buckeye- These placer mines, owned principally by Carson people, have been sold to Chas. Lane, of the firm of Lane, Hayward & Hobart of California. The consideration is said to have been nearly \$250,000. The mines are about 12 miles from Pine Nut, and have been worked in a small way since 1891, but owing to the lack of water, very little gold was taken out. Water must be brought to the property from Alpine County, a distance of many miles. It is estimated this will mean an outlay of \$150,000 or more. The Monarch and the famous Zirn Schulze mines, in the Pine Nut District, are also said to have been bonded to eastern capitalists.a
