DEVELOPMENT: A shallow pit in S9, a stripped area in S10.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: Inactive.

GEOLOGY: The barite veins are hosted by a quartz latite which may be intrusive in origin.
In sec. 10, several separate veins are present in a N-S zone which is about 10'
wide. The individual veins are irregular. The igneous host is unaltered.

In sec. 9, the barite apparently occupies a zone similar to that described for
sec. 10. The zone probably strikes about N65W.

The barite at these locations is quite pure, with only minor FeOxs.
