If such mineralization does occur and is accompanied by hydrothermal alteration and bleaching, as would be probable, these zones could be spotted most quickly and easily from the air. I therefore propose one or at most two days flying by chartered light plane in the four northernmost tiers of townships (T. W. N.-T. 47 N), and extending from the east side of the Santa Rosa Range eastward through R. 42 E. (see geologic map). If no favorable zones were observed the work would terminate with the flying. If such zones were found they would be checked on the ground and samples would be taken for geochemical or assay determination. In a situation such as this it is difficult to estimate the exact time that would be required on the ground, but the total should not be great inasmuch as the work would be mainly sampling and simple mapping.
