As I told you over the phone, in addition to the Golden Fleece Mine Mr. Bernard Granville informs me that he owns the Mina Gold Mines, consisting of 16 Patented Mining Claims, located 7 miles South of the Town of Mina, Nevada, on the S. P. Railway.

The property has a 65 ton counter-current cyanide Pilot Mill and a complete Plant for Mining. Over 6,000 feet of development work has been completed, and, according to Granville, there is enough ore blocked out to keep the Mill running for several months. The property was operated for a period of three months and 3,000 tons of ore were run through the Mill. It averaged better than \$10 per ton.

The Camp has several houses and large boarding house, with running hot and cold water. Entire camp is electric lighted and all roads are in excellent

Mr. Granville suffered the fracture of several vertabrae just after he put his mill in operation and was forced to place it in Receivership pending his recovery in the Hospital. As this is a friendly Receiver, he tells me there is no difficulty in handling the matter upon payment of about \$30,000 to creditors. He says by increasing the capacity of the Mill he can bring eatnings up to \$250,000 per year. Upon receipt of Engineers Report, I'll bring it down for your perusal.
