

The site of the Jamestown mining camp is southeast of the southern mountains

of the Cactus Range.
It lies between
two lines of northwest-southeasttrending mountains:
the Trappman Hills
to the west and
the Gabbard Hills
and Coyote Cuesta
to the east.



The once-active camp developed in

1908. (See Gold Crater for historical setting.) Today no standing structures remain. About 20 yards north of the mine shaft and its tailings is a collapsed 10-foot-square wood-frame structure. The area is littered with cans and other debris from mining days.
