

DESCRIPTION: Three intersecting rhyolite domal intrusions with pumicite cap rock. Pumicite gray to white, generally strongly banded and inhomogeneous. Forms very high hill with very steep slopes locally.

RESERVES: Large.

ACCESS: One mile north to U. S. Highway 40 by improved road and six miles east of Reno.

SOURCES OF DATA: Open file map in Nevada Bureau Mines

ECONOMICS: Although rather inhomogeneous there should be plenty of high quality pumicite in this huge deposit. Reno area has poor aggregates. This could help remedy that situation.

CONCLUSIONS: Important future source of aggregate. Should be investigated.
