GEOLOGY: The mine workings are along a N45°E, 75NW, iron-stained quartz vein that is fault controlled. The host rocks are phyllite from the Auld Lang Syne Formation of Triassic/Jurassic age. The workings have explored the vein for a quarter mile along its strike but none are accessible. Sample 2805 was taken from the dump at the main shaft and from exposed portions of the vein.
