Vanderburg 1936

ANTELOPE DISTRICT

In the Antelop Range 18 miles west of Imlay, Nevada.

The LAST CHANCE consists of 10 unpatented claims; work consists of a tunnel 830 feet long and a shaft 100 feet deep with levels at 40 and 100 feet. Total work amount to 1,600 feet. Principal rocks are shale and porphyry; three veins are exposed in the tunnel. Veins average 4 feet in width and dip about 60 degrees. Ores are stained with manganese and iron oxides. From 1906 to 1928 lessees shipped 1000 tons averaging 40 ounces silver and 8 percent lead. A shipment in 1928 carried 74.8 ounces silver, 20% lead, 1.9% zinc and 0.1% copper; net value per ton was \$53.77. Net proceeds for the 8.3 tons was \$367.28.

It was reported that 5,200 tons on dump averaged 17 ounces silver and 8% lead.

The MAJUBA COPPER MINE; refer to personal notes and reports in file.

The NEVADA SUPERIOR MINES CO. owns two claims four miles north west of the Majuba property; 350 foot inclined shaft and a 2000 foot adit. Silver-lead ore occurs in limestone near a schist contact. A shipment of ore (10.8 tons) carried 57 ounces silver, 33% lead, 1.9% zinc and 0.3% copper, netting \$513.27

ANTELOPE MINE, near Nevada Superior, but no dope.

ARSENIC MINE about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from Majuba, some ore shipped in 1918
