GENERAL REPORT ON THE PROPERTIES OF THE ANTELOPE MINES COMPANY.

PROPERTY. Consists of three claims, the "Top Knot", "Western Union No. 1" and "Jumper" Lodes, also three adjoining claims which may be secured, the "Van Rus," "Antelope View," and "Chloride" Lodes,

LOCATION. These claims are located about 45 miles south-east of Tonopah and 34 miles North-east of Goldfield, in the Antelope Springs Mining District.

DEVELOPMENT The main shaft has been sunk on an incline for 200 feet on WORK. the vein. Samples taken for that distance on the south side of shaft, every five feet gives values averaging \$139.70.

On the north side of the shaft ore averaging over \$35.00 has been exposed in four different places.

About 60 ft. north of main shaft a cross vein is exposed on surface 4 ft. wide averaging \$26.00.

About 120 ft. north of incline shaft is another shaft 50 ft. deep, also on an incline, in which is exposed a 3 ft. vein averaging \$32.00. This vein has been prospected on the surface for a distance of over one mile in a northerly direction.

Directly east of main shaft is another incline shaft about 80 ft. deep giving value ranging from \$8.00 to \$20.00.

To the south of main shaft about 600 ft. distant, ore has been shipped from a 12 ft. shaft averaging \$40.00

At the bottom of the main shaft there is a vein 2 ft. wide averaging \$60.00 per tom.

Several places on south side of main shaft samples were taken which ran from \$1,000.00 to \$1,400.00 per ton.

SHIPMENTS. A total of 148 tons of ore has been shipped from this property averaging \$126.67 giving a gross value of \$18,746.81 and a net value of \$16,835.80, a net value of about \$114.00 per ton.
