DEVELOPMENT: Incline shafts and drifts, trenches and adits, one 2-compartment vertical shaft 150 feet deep.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: Drilling in June by Cominco American Inc.

GEOLOGY: I selected one of the small adits because of its access in highly bleached and argillized rhyolite that has silicified zones within it. The adit was driven on a shear that was sampled 3151 along limonite stained silicified portions of the vein although there was no visible mineralization which is reported to be free gold. The most vein occurs as stringers is about 2 feet wide and bears N45°E, 55NW and seems typical of those examined. Another vein along a shear was exposed in a shaft south of the camp and was also sampled 3152. The vein bears N55°E and dipped to the NW, was about 2 feet wide in altered and bleached white tuff?. Stringer of iron oxidized quartz ranged up to 8" thick
