DEVELOPMENT: Two inclined shafts the older being 200 feet with 1300 feet of laterals
on two levels, a newer shat has about 200 feet of workings.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: Drill just south of the mine.

GEOLOGY: A map of the mine showed a veined shear zone, about 2-3 feet wide
striking northwest and dippping 36°-54° SW and is exposed along the
lower 135 feet of the big incline. For a more complete description
the reader is referred page 44 in Bull 99B of Nevada Bureau of Mines.
As state the deposit appears to be an epithermal deposit that is cut
by numerous faults but the main structure is the post ore Warrior Fault.
Sample 3155 was taken from the dumps of larger shaft and included
quartz vein maerial that was highly oxidized with only minor minerali
zation visable.
