DEVELOPMENT: One major shaft and an open-pit to the south which includes an incline.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Workings are on 1 to 3 foot quartz veins in shales, slates and quartzite of Triassic-Jurassic age. Vain thru the center of camp strikes N 35°E and dips steeply to the W. The best ore came from the shaft and was reported to be worth about \$300,000 while the southern pit produced about \$75,000 in gold ore. The gloryhole to the south has an incline that is still in tact. Sample 2985 is from the southern pit and dumps.
