NEVADA: HUMBOLDT COUNTY:

AWAKENING DISTRICT

Discovered in 1910 by the ALABAMA MINE. Intermittent production then from the Alabama, the Mayday and others from the east side of the SLUMBEH NG HILLS, about 45 miles nor thwest of Winnemucca.

a 5 ten stamp amalgamation mill erected at Daveytown treated about 10,000 tons of gold-silver ore.

the JUMBO MINE, on western side of the Slumbering Hills reactivated the district in 1935. Mine was sold right after discovery for \$10,000. In 1936 a 30 ton amalgamation -concentration mill erected. In first 5 months of 1937 it treated 1,086
tons having a gross value of \$21,735. In 1937 sold again to some
Texans with a reported cash payment of \$250,000. In June 1937
it was treating 38 tons per day averaging \$30 per ton, and 15
menwere working.

The JUMBO is in metamorphosed sediments, principally shale, dipping 55 to 70 degrees east. Gold alloyed with silver occurs in the free-milling state in numerous stringers in the shale. Stringers are in part filled with vein-forming feldspar and a dularia; very little silicification. JUMBO development consists of 6 adits totaling 1000 feet. Mill is on the edge of the Black Rock Desert about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from mine

November 1, 1959: In the Awakening Mining District, the Jumbo Extension 50 ton mill was going into production; 31 miles north of Winnemucca on the I. O. N. Highway.

It was reported that while excavating for mill building a body of ore was uncovered, assaying high in chromium and tin.
