

NAME OF PROPERTY

Al Dees Tungsten Mine -

D. A. Dees of Eureka, Nevada - Owner; Alva H. Garrett - Lessee.

LOCATION OF PROPERTY

The mine is located in Ruby Mountain Mining District, White Pine County, in Ruby Mountain National at south end of Ruby Mountains. Property reached by auto from Eureka by driving southeasterly on U. S. Highway No. 50 a distance of 15 miles, then turning north up Newark Valley over unimproved dirt road a distance of 60 miles.

GEOLOGY AND ORE DISTRIBUTION

The claims cover a broad area of granite which was formerly overlain with limestone beds. The limestone has been eroded away except for a few relatively small remnants now highly metamorphosed to fine grained silica with some metamorphic minerals so fine grained that they are barely discernible to the naked eye. Two of these remnants of former limestone, on Lucy D claim, constitute the orebodies. Ore Block No. 1 is 125 feet long, 45 feet wide, and 15 feet thick. Ore Block No. 2 is 100 feet long, 40 feet wide, and 15 feet thick.

Tungsten in form of scheelite - with some powellite - is apparently quite uniformly distributed throughout the two remnant blocks.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

Property consists of 10 contiguous unpatented Lode claims, 3 Lucy Ds, 2 Alice Bs, 3 Woodpeckers, and two other claims.

Development work consists of four shallow tunnels, and small shaft 25 feet deep in granite. Tunnel No. 4 is entirely in granite. Tunnels 1 and 3 are driven in ore in Block No. 2, and Tunnel No. 2 taps Ore Block No. 1.

ORE RESERVES

The ore reserves consist of - Ore Block No. 1 estimated to contain 6500 tons of .95%  $WO_3$ ; Ore Block No. 2 estimated to contain 4600 tons of .45%  $WO_3$ .
