

DESCRIPTION Gold deposits in quartz-pyrite veins with native gold. Gold also occurs in copper sulfide veins. Other deposits are silver-lead fracture fillings and quartz-stibnite veins. Gold was mainly a by-product of copper and silver ores before 1932. After 1932, copper and silver were the chief commodities.
