Dear Mr. Adams:

I take this opportunity to thank you for copy of your letter to Mr. Henry D. Ott, of Chico, California, and hope he will cooperate and get his property into production, but he has had it in his head to be the operator for the investor, because he is an expert Gold Dredging Engineer and Geologist, but that as arule does not set well with the possible interested investors.

At this time I am calling to the attention of Mr. Pearce, now at the Olympic Hotel, Seattle, Wn. The gahl Placers located near Battle Mountain, Nevada with a resume from the property ownership Mr. Chas L. Caldwell-this could be of interest as it can be operated I am told by dredge or dragline and dredge-as other methods can be used other than dredge from what another engineer tells me that I know and witnessed the property a couple years ago-I have an extra copy on the Dahl Placers and will enclose one to you as well as to Mr. Pearce.
