This property, submitted by the owner, Mr. Harry Springer of Lovelock and Mina, Nevada, includes a group of 20 claims in the so-called Lava Beds District about fifty miles north of Lovelock, Nevada and about 13 miles south of the Trego station of the Western Pacific.

It has been developed by several open cuts and a few short tunnels on an extensive limestone granite contact along which the limestone has been garnetized for considerable widths and over a long distance following the irregular granite contact. Some high grade ore was shipped from this property during the World War by Mr. Springer but has remained dormant since that time.

It was visited with Mr. Springer on November 8th.

Visible coarse scheelite could be seen in many of the open cuts, specimens of which were checked under the fluoroscope at Lovelock.

Mr. Springer offers the property for \$50,000 on long terms with no payment down for at least a year.

This property is rather remote from transportation via Lovelock but is close to the Western Pacific over easy grades. This region is a winter range for sheep and is reported to be much freer of snow than most of the surrounding country. This property seems to warrant some preliminary trenching and sampling to determine the extent and width of the ore bearing garnet zones. The lower and most promising zone suggests the possibility of developing ore widths up to fifty feet for lengths of one thousand feet or more. This property can be prospected following or during the work on the "County" ground.
