LOCATION OF PROPERTY

In Oneota Mining District; Sections 31 and 36, Township 1 N., Range 33 and 34 E., E.D.B.M., Esmeralda County, Nevada. The nearest railroad point is Coaldale on the Tonopah & Goldfield Railroad, extending from Mina to Goldfield. Coaldale is a small station on the last named Railroad, and consists of a loading platform, a gasoline station, and a few houses. It is 27 miles from the subject property; 16 miles of the road are surfaced, but the last eleven miles are almost impassable during certain seasons of the year. The nearest town of any consequence is Tonopah, 66 miles from the mine.

The altitude at the property is approximately 8,000 feet above sea level.

APPLICANT'S INTEREST IN OR OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY

Applicant claims to be owner by virtue of deed from former owners. However deed, nor copy of same, was not submitted.

LOAN REQUESTED

\$10,000.00.

LOAN RECOMMENDED

None.

COMMENTS

Assay map prepared by the U. S. Bureau of Mines, and submitted by Applicant, indicates that an examination of the property is not warranted.

The weighted average of 58 samples taken by the Bureau of Mines, and shown on the map in question, is .62 lbs. of mercury per ton.

The F. & L., or Richards Quicksilver Claims appear to be a sub-marginal mercury deposit. In addition to their unfavorable mineral character, they also suffer by an unfavorable geographic location, and the fact that they will be inaccessible during winter storms. As I recall, the claims are above 8000 feet in elevation, and six miles east of Boundary Peak which is over 13,000 feet in elevation.


Mr. Thompson of the U.S. Bureau of Mines informed me the Bureau had approved an access road for the B & B Quicksilver Mine, an adjacent property to the Richards Claims, but the WPB has passed unfavorably upon the project, notwithstanding the fact that the B & B Mine is amply financed and presumably directed by a competent engineer.

Enclosed is copy of Edgar Bailey's U.S.G.S. report and a supplemental report by Mr. E. Y. Dougherty, U.S. Bureau of Mines engineer, both furnished through the courtesy of Mr. Thompson of the Bureau.

The best sample listed by Mr. Dougherty is 2.5 ft., 2.3 pounds of mercury per ton, cut from trench No. 9.

My weighted average computed from the data listed on the U.S. Bureau of Mines assay map filed with the application is 0.62 pound mercury per ton for the 53 samples cut. The highest grade sample listed on the map is No. 119 - which is 6 feet of 2.9 pounds of mercury per ton.

It is concluded from the consistently low value of the samples cut by the Bureau of Mines that this property does not warrant the use of loan funds to prospect at greater depth a deposit which has been conclusively proven sub-marginal.

It will be noted in Mr. Overton's office memorandum dated September 20, 1943, that the War Production Board has passed unfavorably upon a project to build a road to the B & B Mine, an adjoining property - notwithstanding the fact that the B & B Mine is apparently well financed, and presumably directed by a competent engineer.

Applicant, judging from his letterhead, is a physician and surgeon, residing in Inglewood, California.

The statement is made in the application that the total production to date from the subject property is 15 flasks of quicksilver.

An alleged report is submitted by Richard Charles King, to which reference is hereby specifically made. Under the sub-division "CRE", he states:

"Assay made by Smith, Emery and by Iweis & Walter indicate a fair average of .75% or about 15 lbs per ton. The size of the exposed ore body would reasonably indicate a strong showing for more ore with depth (until the ore was bottomed)."

He also states:

"The facilities for a camp are good. The view would make this spot very attractive for summer homes."

Under the same caption, the statement is made:

"The high point, where the ore bodies are strong, is a spot selected for the camp site."

I presume this would strengthen the view.

He further states:

"The grade on the road is steep. It would require resurveying to lower it."

Under remarks, Mr. King really says something, to-wit:

"The most difficult thing in mining is to find the ore."

He further states:

"****the only difference between money in the bank and ore in the ground is a matter of extraction and processing."

A LOAN IS NOT RECOMMENDED.
