DEVELOPMENT: Fifty-feet north of good road, and old inclined shaft which was caved about 40 ft.

GEOLOGY: A series of prospects and small adits and shafts lay in a east-west alignment along corral canyon on the northside of Bare Mt. Locally the Slaven Chert and shales of the Valmeys are being intruded by granite, probably the same stock as Granite Mt.? The above unnamed prospect was typical of the mineralization exhibited in the area, in that small quartz veins with sulfide minerals were present. Sample 673.
Photo 22 is of the dump and inclined shaft.

The same area was being very actively explored by roads, pits and drilling for barite.
Photo 23 was taken in section 6 on the SE side of Bare Mt.
