Huntsman Ranch 7 1/2'DEVELOPMENT: Claims are developed by several open cuts, trenches & a few drifts. Some of the work looks recent, ie. completed in last 2 years.ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None, but claims are current.

GEOLOGY: The main working on the Try-Light claims consists of one large cut in sec. 18 which trends N15W & is approximately 100' long & 15' high. The cut explores white, thinly bedded, diatomaceous sediments of Miocene age. The beds dip about 30° to the NE & the cut explores the sediments along their N-NW strike. Although most of the cut is in diatomaceous sediments, the lower third of the exposed (cut) face consists of grey silty mudstones with sandy inter layers. Several small faults with less than 1" displacements cut the exposed sediments.

The diatomite "bed" outcrops in several places throughout the low hills north of the highway. Trenches & open cuts are developed along the strike of this unit for several mile north of this location in sec. 18 & 7.

The prospect in sec. 26, T34N, R52E was examined briefly from road. It is a small cut in diatomite.
