

- a. Flowery district, Storey County, Nevada.
- b. Geographic coordinates: $39^{\circ}19'$ N., $119^{\circ}35\frac{1}{2}'$ W.
- c. Status of exploitation: Located in 1860. Operations centered about Lady Brian mine, one of the earliest potential claims. Irregular production history, but incomplete records give a value of \$1,049,507 for gold-silver ore mined from 1860 to 1929. From 1924 to 1929 a quarter million tons of ore yielded \$945,000.
- d. References: Univ. of Nev. Bull., v. 44, no. 1, March 1950, p. 48-50.
- e. Adequacy of our present knowledge: Probably inadequate.
- f. Topographic coverage: Adequate. Virginia City 15-min. quad., 1950.
- g. Major mineralogic and geologic features: Altered andesite mineralized by network of gold-bearing quartz stringers plus oxidized silver ore. Quartz monzonite is reported to occur in underground workings. Free gold ore occurs on footwall whereas ore on the hanging wall carries all the silver-lead and zinc minerals.
