LOCATION OF PROPERTY

Salmon River Mining District, Elko County, Nevada, 6.5 miles by unimproved dirt road westerly from Contact, Nevada.

GEOLOGY

540 to 65° S.E. dipping fissure vein in series of sedimentary rocks, principally limestone, striking northeast and dipping northwest at about 20°. Granite mass (Alaskite) underlies sedimentaries with offshoots or dikes and sill intruding them. Economic minerals are copper carbonates and silicates.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY

Property consists of 2 patented and 8 unpatented claims. Principal mine workings located, for the greater part, on Bomanza No. 4, and Bomanza Fraction consist of several small tunnels, open cuts and an old inaccessible shaft reportedly 75 feet deep.
