DEVELOPMENT: several vertical and inclined shafts

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None, but new road put in within 100 yards of site

GEOLOGY: Site is several inclined, vertical shafts along a northerly trend. Workings collared in alluvium, so no structure apparent. Rocks on dump consist of granitic and dioritic augen gneiss cut by malachite stained quartz veins. Hornfelsic rocks also observed on the dump. Rocks Fe-Mn oxide stained. Site is death trap, rotting timbers, open shafts.

REMARKS: The name Nippeno has been arbitrarily assigned to this site since 2 out of 3 references place the mine here, however, it has also been assigned to the workings approximately 1 mile north of Crescent Peak, and the sections 25 and 27, 28S, 61E. This site was the closest to the general description.
