DEVELOPMENT: May have been a short adit(?) If so, it's caved. Currently there's only a "cat road" up the side of the mountain. Pendant @ end of road has been opened up.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None & hasn't been for some time.

GEOLOGY: Small - 50' x 200 +' schistose hornfels enclosed in granodiorite (small pendant). Copper oxides are fairly abundant & occur along fractures in both the granodiorite & hornfels. Minor altered along contact between hornfels & granodiorite - mainly bleaching. Opened cut above "road cut" shows plentiful copper oxides.

Most of mineralization appears to be in granodiorite along contact & most of it seems to be along the north contact zone. Also white Fe-stained quartz vein material lying around surface. Didn't see any in place.

(2) Prospect to north in sec. 8. Same as these - contact meta. Small adit, trends N60°E may be 100 + feet long. Heavily Fe-stained hornfels & quartz lying on dump. Sample #2408. Property staked in April 1981 by above people. Nash Claims of Gianella and Mountain View tungsten prospect of Bonham.

REMARKS: Property restaked in March 1981 by above named owners. Picture #8 on camera Looking NE @ north side of contact between hornfel & granodiorite cut @ top of picture shows fair amount of copper oxides. Sample #2407.
