Jim Elliott has yet to pull together the data on our trip to the Indian Springs tungsten deposit and we probably won't get it done until later on this summer. When we do, I will get the information to you and Bob Coats. In the mean time here is the location to take care of your immediate needs:

Dairy Valley Quad. (15'), Nevada-Utah -- in the south half of unsurveyed Sec. 10, T. 43 N., R. 68 E., Elko County. The deposit is adjacent to the west quadrangle boundary and is roughly outlined by the westward-open horseshoe-shaped jeep trail that has three X's on the south limb and one X on the north. Access to the deposit is from Granite Creek via the unimproved road that takes off about one mile north of the Mill Creek Reservoir.

I'm off to the Boulder-Pioneer wilderness project for the summer. Hope that this will do you until fall. Have a good summer yourself.
