REPORT ON THE
EDISON NEVADA PROPERTY - ORMSBY COUNTY, NEVADA.

LOCATION.

The Edison Nevada property is located in Ormsby County, Nevada. (Section 3- T 14 N - R 21 E) About twelve miles east of Carson City, twelve miles south of Virginia City and about seven miles up Brunswick Canon from the railroad station of Brunswick.

TITLE.

The Edison Nevada Group consists of five claims owned by A. F. Hake by right of location and possession.

HISTORY.

The Edison Nevada Claim was first located in the early Virginia City days as the Phoenix Claim. Was later located as the Edison Claim and held as such for thirty three years by G. Wilson and F. D. Blair when they gave it up. The claim was then located by A. F. Hake January 1st, 1918 and has been held by him since that time. They claim that there has been several thousand dollars worth of ore mined from the surface holes. All of this ore was shipped to local mills on the Carson River. These mills are now abandoned.

WORKINGS.

LOWER TUNNEL. There has been about 325 feet of work done in this tunnel. The total depth attained from the surface is approximately 35 feet.

UPPER TUNNEL. The upper tunnel is about twelve feet higher than the lower tunnel and has about 225 feet of work done .

WEST HOLE AND CUT. Surface cut thirty feet long by eight feet wide from which there has been eighty to ninety feet of under ground work done. It was from this cut and hole that

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EQUIPMENT.

There is no equipment on the property.

GEOLOGY.

The property is traversed by a wide belt of porphyry or highly altered silicified rhyolite. The country rock being a fine grained andesite.

The ore being an undefined bunch in the porphyry with no hanging wall or foot wall that was definable.

CONCLUSIONS.

From the following samples it will be noted that the values are so low that the property is not worthy of further consideration.
