assay \$20.00 ran 30 cents.

even though it is close to Tonopah.

My dear Sir:

The Sutherland Divide Mining Company is incorporated under the laws of the State of Nevada with a capitalization of 1,500,000 shares, of a par value of 10¢ per share, non assessable.

The Company owns six and one-half ^{UN} patented claims known as Unlight Group, in the Gold Mountain District, these claims being situated five miles southerly from Tonopah.

The officers of the Company are as follows:

President,	Chas. R. Evans, mining man and congressional candidate.
Vice-Prest. & G.M.	Jos. B. Kendall, mining man, formerly Gen'l Supt. of The Goldfield Consolidated Mines Company.
Secy. & Treas.	F. B. Mechling, Manager, Nevada-California Power Company.

Directors, The above officers and Chas. W. Webster and R.W. Cattermole.

Stock in the above Company was originally subscribed as follows:

This stock is all in pool until December 1, 1918.

It has recently been found that J. E. Bevis has assigned some of his stock.

There is a well defined ledge running about east and west through the property for its length of 3300 feet. Samples from the surface show values of from \$4.00 to \$40.00 per ton. These values are about 40% in gold and 60% in silver. Some very high grade gold values have been secured on the surface from a seam on the easterly portion of the Unlight claim.

There is one vertical shaft 200 feet deep and one incline shaft between 130 and 140 feet. No lateral work has been done in these shafts so far as known by the present owners. It is probable that the shafts would have to be retimbered if used.

In 1907 Mr. Jos. B. Kendall leased the property and shipped ore from surface workings which resulted in a net profit to him of \$18.00 per ton. The price of silver then was much lower than at present.

At a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Sutherland Divide Mining Company held August 5, 1918, it was

RESOLVED: That the Sutherland Divide Mining Company and its stockholders transfer to J. Harvey Whiteman and associates all of the treasury stock (800,000 shares) and sufficient of their personal holdings to aggregate a total of 55% of the total capitalization of 1,500,000 shares, or 825,000 shares. In consideration of said transfer of stock, J. Harvey Whiteman and associates to develop the property, performing not less than 40 feet of shaft work or 100 feet of underground lateral work in any one month between a date sixty days after the acceptance of this proposal and September 1, 1919. The 825,000 shares of stock to be issued to J. Harvey Whiteman and associates and deposited in escrow in any bank named by them and to be surrendered by that bank to them September 1, 1919, unless during the period prior to that date they may have failed to perform the monthly work above provided for, in which case the stock is to be returned to the treasury of the Company. Should labor troubles, war conditions or other causes beyond the control of J. Harvey Whiteman and associates cause a suspension of the work, an extension of time is to be allowed them equal to the period of unavoidable delay. The present officers and directors to resign, thus leaving the control of Company affairs to J. Harvey Whiteman and associates.

The property is fully paid for and deed is of record from Hugh Sutherland to Sutherland Divide Mining Company.

There are no incumbrances aside from a few small items of incidental that the present stockholders will take care of personally.

It is presumed that in the event you desire to entertain this proposition you will desire to draw your own form of agreement, in which case the stockholders of the company would appreciate the action at your earliest convenience, for the reason that it is desired to take the matter of development up through other parties should you not view it favorably.
