DEVELOPMENT: One shaft many recent dozer cuts, road improvement from Cherry Creek dates from about 1979.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: Robinson Industries and Assoc. staking of the surrounding area dates from 9-6-84.

GEOLOGY: The old shaft was sunk sometime around 1918 in a gossan-like, highly oxidized vein that is partly brecciated and iron stained. The vein is in badly fractured triassic meta-volcanics. Capping the older sediments are dark flow rock. The dozer-cuts are mostly N-S and maybe intended to cut the E-W vein system. Sample 2951 is from the dump and adit near the shaft.

A copper rich quartz vein material is piled near the site of a shack at the bottom of the hill.
