I have control of twenty-six mineral claims known as the Copper Mountain Group, situated 44 miles in a southeasterly direction from Las Vegas, Nevada, more widely known as the Nelson Mining District. These claims lie at the head of Eldorado Canyon, seven miles from the Colorado River and twelve miles from the proposed Boulder Canyon dam and power site, and are easily accessible by auto road.

With two veins cutting the mountain which is 1500 feet long, 1200 feet wide and 500 feet high, running in an easterly and westerly direction, with cross veins cutting them in an northerly and southerly direction, forming large bodies of ore. "One vein 110 feet wide on surface, assaying 32% copper, 9 oz. silver, \$3.00 gold." The general character of the ore is sulphide. At the foot of the mountain there is a shaft 62 feet deep, showing 47 feet of ore and have not found the foot wall yet. Mill run tests have shown 30% Copper, 60 oz. silver and \$18.00 gold. Also has 175 ft. of tunnel and other shafts.

Water can be had from the River for mill and from a working standpoint, conditions are excellent.
