DEVELOPMENT: Site is vertical shaft, stoped to the west, with peripheral surface cuts and trenches. Additional shafts to the north.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Workings at this site follow an 18 inch wide, vertical, N50E striking white quartz vein which cuts biotite rich schist/gneiss. Kinzigites were observed in float, and breccia from depth was observed on the dump. Pods of specularite occur in the quartz vein and host rocks. Across the drainage (north) pegmatite dikes were observed intruding the metamorphic rocks. Dikes composed of megacrystals of muscovite and feldspars. The quartz vein exhibited sericitic alteration and vugs were stained with FeOx-MnO₂. Area shows propylitic/chloritic alteration. Below the sample site was a 200 foot trench in kingzigite. Area shows surface exploration within last 2 years.
