GEOLOGY: On the surface the mine is surrounded by limestone that has been intruded by alaskite dikes, but on the dump all of the vein material is quartz in granodiorite. The claims and mine are owned by Eddie Bukner of Fallon, who resides at the townsite of Ellsworth in the summer. The claims are just to the west of Ellsworth townsite on the northside of the canyon. Photo #12 is of the mine workings. Mr. Bukner also owns 149 claims to the west that are currently being leased by Carminco.

The Grand View mine is on a quartz vein which is also cross-cutting aplite dikes which have intruded a dark-grey limestone. There is some skarn-epidote mineralization but it is not dominate at the mine site. The quartz veins and veinlets have intruded along faults and fractures. Brecciation is common within the vein system, which is mineralized with minor CuS, CuO, Wolframinte?, as well as silver. Sampel #1102. There is some calcification and silicification along the rind of the veins.
