stream drainage before turning north to the mine is still usable.

GEOLOGY: The workings are all on a fissure vein bearing N30°-40°W, 45°-55°NE.
that follow the strike up the side of the mountain, one above the other
but because of the movement of air the workings are probably intercon-
ected. The vein is 4-5 feet wide in a shaley, thin-bedded limestong and
can be traced on the surface for over a 1000ft. The vein and gouge zone
are argillized, iron stained with silicified zones and brecciation.
The sample 3165 was chipped from the vein in one of the open stopes.
Ore from the mine was milled locally at different times but the exact
location was not described or observed in the field.
