FARREL (STONEHOUSE) DISTRICT

On the east slope of the Seven Troughs Range, north of the Seven Troughs district. First discovery in 1863. Interest revived in 1907 by activity in Seven Troughs. Rich gold found in float, but no prominent mines discovered. Produced about \$50,000 with nearly all of it shipping ore

At FARRELL nine patented claims. Property has an adit several hundred feet long and a 200 foot inclined shaft. A small mill at Farrell in 1935, and treated 200 tons of ore. Not a success because water supply inadequate.

Ore occurs in seams and lenses in rhyolite. Vein material carries considerable green fluorite mixed with quartz and altered rhyolite. Values are chiefly gold and silver.

MONARCH GROUP, two miles north of Farrell consists of four unpatented claims. in 1929 the SEVENTROUGHS EXTENSION COMPANY, worked the property, erecting a 50 ton flotation plant in 1930. Flotation was superseded by amalgamation after it did not work. After about 1500 tons were treated, mostly from mine dumps, mill was sold by sheriff's sale. Production from the mill totaled \$6,000. In 1935 owner worked property and shipped one carload of ore. The 19 tons gave a net of \$253.72. Heads carried 0.655 ounces gold and 4.05 ounces silver.
