Location

The claims are located in the Ferber Mining District which is in the Southeast corner of Elko County, Nevada near the Utah-Nevada state line. The claims are located in Sections 4, 5 and 6 in T.27N., R.70E. (Map attached).

History

Mrs. Greenhouse submits 11 patented claims for sale at the above location. The claims are in three separate parcels. Parcel No. 1 - three claims. Parcel No. 2 - four claims. Parcel No. 3 - four claims. These claims are not contiguous, but they are near each other.

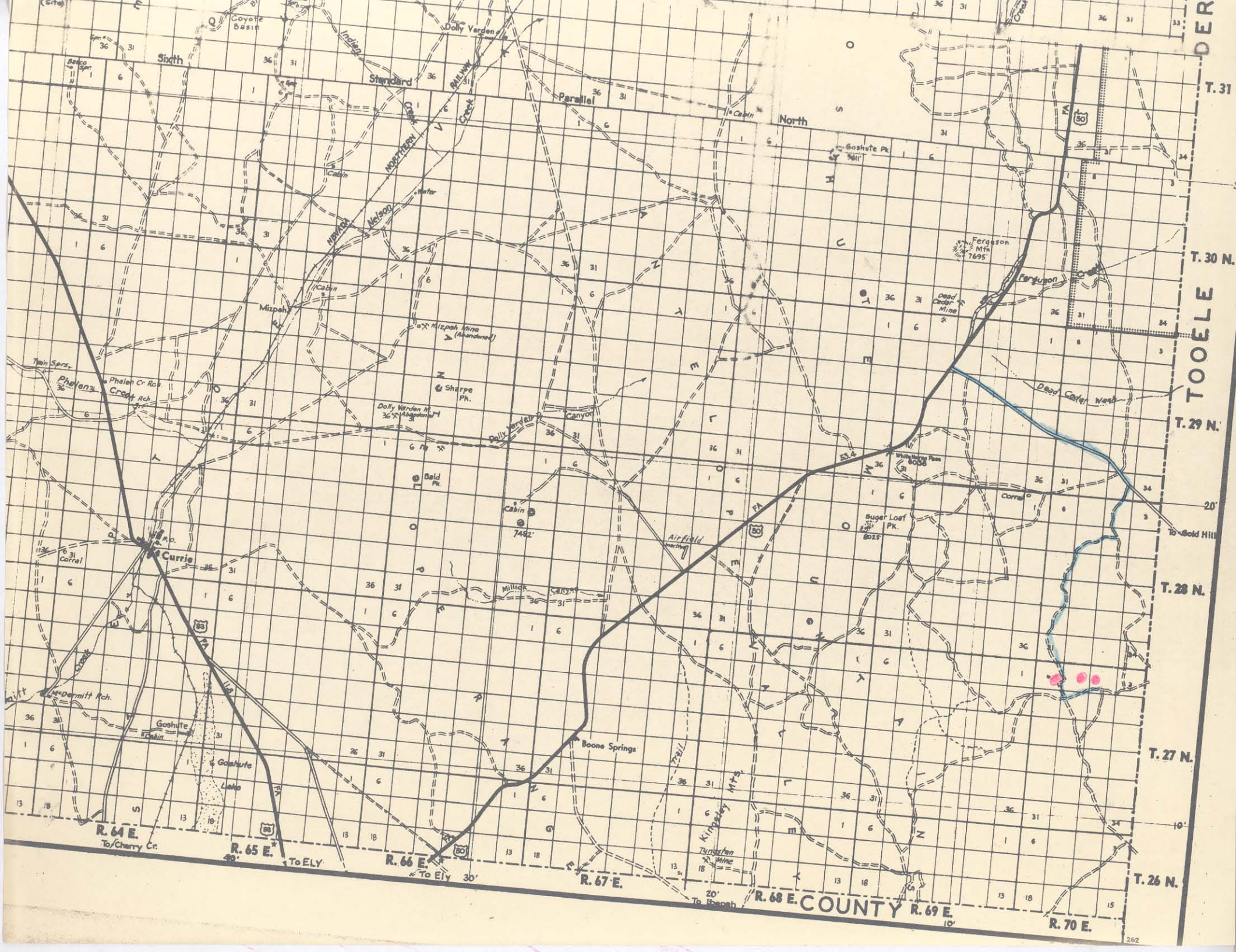
Newmont is doing some work in the area, but they have not contacted Mrs. Greenhouse.

This area has not been extensively worked and Mrs. Greenhouse believes that the area would lend itself to a large open pit operation.

A report of the Ferber Mining District is herein submitted. It was written in 1920. The values are in copper, lead and silver with some gold. The ore deposits are in three classes. Contact metamorphic, copper garnetized and crystalized lime and replacement silver - lead in crystalized lime. There are fissure veins with values cutting all the formations. There has been extensive development work and a lot of ore has been shipped to the smelter. However, there has been no work done to any great depth. The report suggests more drilling and digging.

Note:

Since the report was written in 1920, there has probably been more work done. This district has produced some copper and lead with some gold and silver.
