PRELIMINARY REPORT OF SILVER SADDLE GROUP.

NAME AND OWNER

Chas. F. Goss.

LOCATION AND HOLDINGS

These claims are located adjoining the Indian Queen mine on the south-east and are in Esmeralda County, Nevada.

There are 5 claims in this group.

ACCESSIBILITY AND TRANSPORTATION

Steep road to Indian Queen Mine, 6 miles from Tonopah-Bishop Highway at Queen's Station, but last half mile just trail.

GEOLOGY

The country rocks are shale and rhyolite.

The ore occurs in the shale and is probably just some of the apex mineralization of the Queen vein, which is a flat east-west vein in the shale that dips to the north.

VEINS AND ORE BODIES

Here Mr. Goss stated that 30 feet of vein matter carried about 40 ozs. silver but only spots of ore showed any appreciable value.

Goss shipped a few tons that ran 160 ozs. silver and spots of good ore account for dump running 8.40 ozs.
