

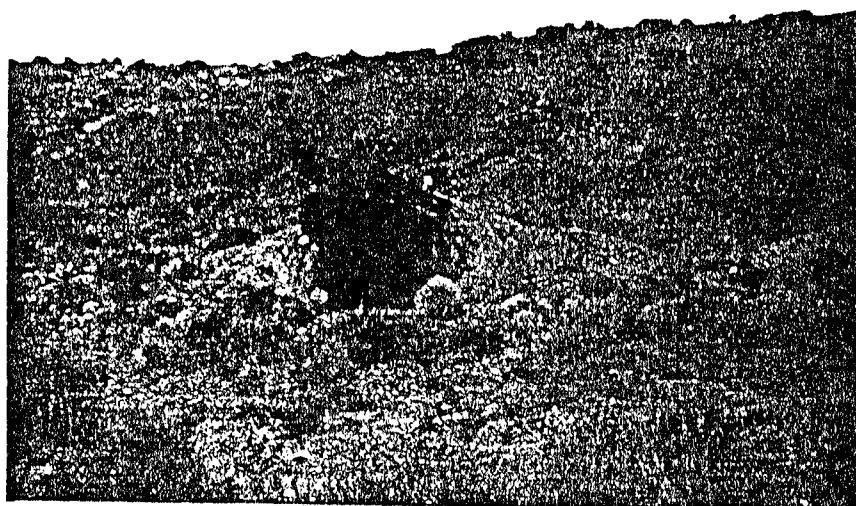

Approximately five miles south of Gilbert and one mile north of a location called Devil's Gate is a mining area containing prospects, shafts, adits, and a few structures.



The principal structure at this location is a wood-frame dugout approximately 12' x 8' and 9 feet high at the ridge-pole. The structure has 2" x 12" exterior wood siding and 4" x 4" vertical supports and corner posts. Laminated 2" x 4"

studs give support to the earth banks on either side of the structures. The roof is constructed of 2" x 12" boards with 4" x 6" joists and is sheathed with tar paper covered with earth. An 8-inch pipe rises 1-1/2 feet above the roofline. Sunk into the floor in the interior of the dugout is a box 4' x 2'-4" x 1'-6" deep that was used to store explosives. This structure is in good condition despite some erosion.
