Memorandum on SNOWSTORM CLAIM

Pershing County, Nevada

Location

On June 20, I visited the Snowstorm Claim, located in Pershing County, Neveda, six miles southwest from Lovelock. The property is reached by driving 3 miles south from Lovelock on U. S. Highway Number 40 to a dirt road on the right, and three miles along this respect a gravel quarry. The claim lies at an elevation of 4500 feet.

History and Ownership

The claim was located by Wayne Stoker in December, 1942, and Rare Metals Corporation of Lovelock, Nevada, Mas recently taken an option on it.

Equipment and Development

Development work on the property consists of IO shallow pits scattered over a 200x200 foot area. At the time of my visit, no equipment was on the property, and no production had been made.

J. Heizer of Rare Metals Corporation of Lovelock, Nevada, hopes to bulldoze the surface to further explore the claim.

Geology

The claim lies in an area of blocky hornfeld, striking from morth to northwest and dipping steeply to the northeast. The hornfels is intruded by a small aplitic dike, striking from due west to morthwest (see sketch map). Narrow pode of tactite in the hornfels carry scheelite.

Schoolite Deposits

Small lenticular pods of coarse garnet-epidote tactite occur scattered throughout the hornfels. These pods carry scheelite ranging in grade from 0.1% to 3.0%, and mineralization is extremely spotty. No pod is wider than 6 inches, and several of them are only I to 2 inches wide. They cannot be traced on the surface further than IO feet along the strike.

Reserves

Scattered over small dumps on the claim is one ton of 0,5% ore. Possibly more ore could be taken out and hand sorted by leasers, but it is not likely that this claim contains any mineable reserves of tungsten.
