The Bradford & Hartley Milling Co. has just cleaned up the first trial run of ore and in treating 19 tons from the Boyle lease, which has 1200 tons to treat, results gave \$63.20 to the ton. This mill saves it practically all and this milling co. will add another unit at once.

The Geyman mill has finished another tonnage from the Riley & Riddell Leasing Co and gave results \$38. The mill will next work Ripsaw mine ore, several hundred tons.

The Rex Mine Co. is getting its mill ready; enough ore is blocked out for many months.

The Eastern Star, known as the Tracey mine on Frazer Creek, has the sensational ore of the district. Down 25' in the winze, which is 100' from the surface, they have "excellent" ore. The ledge is 24" wide and the quartz is literally covered with gold.

The Ripsaw lease No. 1 has continued sinking and the ore is all milling and the entire width of the shaft. Assays from \$16 to \$500 are results every day. Milling the ore from this lease will start at once and will keep the 50-ton mill busy for some time to come. The Elko Prince mine will soon be in the course of active development.

Experts are sampling the Midas, better known as the Bamberger. The property was closed down after sinking about 100' about a year ago. Several thousand dollars worth of picture ore is scattered over the country from the original strike. A grab sample at 80' sampled \$42.
