A Golconda, Nevada, correspondent of the Winnemucca Star says: Too much cannot be said about the camp of Gold Circle, to which Golconda is the nearest railroad point, for the mines there are making good. Joe Fayant and Richard Vannetti were at the camp last week and both speak in glowing terms of the properties being worked there. They state that the new mill is pounding away on ore with gratifying results. A run of 100 tons of ore from the Fayant, Ludwick & Schloss lease on the Esmeralda is to be made next week. The rock is estimated to average \$50 to the ton in gold. The company is expecting a new custom this mill to arrive any day. When this mill is erected Gold Circle will have two rductions works, with the prospect of another one being built there in near future.

The Rex property, owned by Nikirk, Horton & Rosthchild, is fast developing into a great mine with large bodies of high grade milling ore.

The leasers on the Esmeralda are still taking out large quantities of ore, both of the high-grade and milling grade. The James Boyle block is proving a wonder on account of the disclosures of high-grade ore there. Fayant, Ludwick & Schloss are working their lease steadily and disclosing large quantities of ore.

The Yeadon and Riley & Ruddell leases are both proving good and can show much ore. On the Poorman group a three-foot vein is being developed that carries a good

grade of milling ore.
