The Gomes Mine.

This lies to the north of the Crown and has the continuation of the Crown vein. At present the owner Harry Gomes is mining at sagebrush roots on a silver-lead parallel vein, and has sorted out a few tons of shipping ore.

August 9. Battle Mountain.

There are steady shipments of ore from Battle Mountain, mainly from scattered leaser operations. Our first day's trip was to the southeast to the Copper Canyon and Galena districts.

Gold Butte Property.

This old property relocated last year by "Reg" Oliver, is on a branch of Duck Creek and north of Iron Canyon. This gold quartz vein with a N 10° W and 60° dip to the east, is developed by a 150 ft. shaft and connecting tunnel, with considerable old time stoping. Recently locators shipped the tailings from the old mill site, indicating high grade ore. Mr. Oliver has established a neat camp and is now making a thorough geological study of the mine before attempting to mine possible faces of shipping ore. He was the
