Judge Langwith's Property.

This is a group of ll claims in a slate formation with two kinds of quartz veins, one being silver lead, the other silver and gold, both having a general N 15% W strike and steep dip to the west.

The lead-silver veins have been opened up by cuts, tunnels and shallow shafts, and a few carloads of ore shipped out. The main shaft, 115 ft. deep, is filled with water below the 30 ft. level. The 150 ft. of drifting on this texas harrow vein on this level with so little stoping, as in the case of the other workings, does not offer much encouragement.

On the westerly Mary No. 11, claim, there is a bold parallel outcropping quartz vein, that appears to be the southerly continuation of the Crown Vein. One small trench across it is the work done to date, which the owner claims is in "\$6.00 gold ore." This is a promising vein for development.
