The Crown Mine.

This mine is under option to Mr. Roy Hardy of Reno, Nevada, whose Crown Consolidated Co. has installed a diesel engine, generator, motor, and Sullivan compressor along with good shop equipment in preparation for mining a 400 ft. ore shoot of low grade gold-silver ore, 30' wide, with 150 ft. of backs above the tunnel level. Grading has been completed for a 1000 ft. tramway, along with excavation for a 300 ton mill. At present the property is idle awaiting financing of the mill.

The Gomes Mine.

This lies to the north of the Crown and has the continuation of the Crown vein. At present the owner Harry Gomes is mining at sagebrush roots on a silver-lead parallel vein, and has sorted out a few tons of shipping ore.

August 9. Battle Mountain.

There are steady shipments of ore from Battle Mountain, mainly from scattered leaser operations. Our first day's trip was to the southeast to the Copper Canyon and Galena districts.
