DEVELOPMENT: A single incline shaft, headframe still standing and in good condition
largely due to the fact that it was very well built..road is gone.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Quartz veins in metasiltstone bearing N30°E, 45-55NW. The shaft was sunk on a vein that is brecciated near the surface although most of the quartz material on the dump is not brecciated. The incline is tracked and appears to still be useable. Most of the host rocks are metasiltstones and numerous bull quartz veins crop out along the mountain sides and litter the land scape as skree. Sample 2852 was selected from the dump and exposed vein. The road up Box Canyon is gone about a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of the east entrance and the road up to the mine from Box Canyon is not obvious nor can the mine be seen from the canyon
