

The Humboldt National Forest, Mountain City Ranger District is inviting public comment on a mineral exploration project proposed by Uranerz U.S.A., Inc. This proposal is a continuation of exploration activities in the area. The project is located 17 miles northeast of Tuscarora, Nevada; in the Schoonover, Coffin, Chicken, and Mill Creek drainages. The following is the legal location and description of the proposed project.

Plan of operation #726276-96. Legal description - Sections 16, 19, 20, 21, 28, 30, & 33, T.42N., R.53E., Mount Diablo Meridian. Uranerz has proposed the construction of just under one mile of temporary exploration road and the drilling of 11 holes. The total disturbance will be approximately 3 acres located on National Forest system lands.

Based on our experience with previous projects of this nature, our initial concerns for this proposed project include:

- 1. The effects on riparian areas and water quality and quantity.
- 2. Impacts on wildlife species and habitat.
- 3. Impacts on threatened, endangered and sensitive plant species.
- 4. Productive use of reclaimed land.
- 5. Impacts to other National Forest System land users including, but not limited to livestock permittees and recreationists.
- 6. Impacts to cultural resources.
