Humboldt Cnty: News has been brought to Winnemucca of an important copper discovery in the Jackson Mts., about 32 miles from Junco, a station in the Western Pacific RR. According to reports of miners there are two distinct copper-bearing lodes, traceable for 12,000 feet with a width of 1800 feet. One vein contains carbonate; the other consists of sulphides. Assays range from 1% to 15% copper. Arrangements have been made to ship the best ore to Junco by Mule team and negotiations are proceeding to the building of a 50 ton mill.
