My Dear Sir,

I am writing to know if you can give me Mr H.P. Henderson's New York address - The same gentleman who was with the Tonopah Mining Co so long and afterwards on the Goldfield Consolidated - I want to write him about Jarbridge and see if I cannot get him to come in here - He is consulting engineer for some New York company I am told - I am wondering if you yourself could not induce some of the T-M people to come in here and look the camp over with the view of taking over some one of the properties to be found here - I am particularly interested in placing the Bourne mine whose discovery two years ago brought this camp into existence and since then has made Jarbridge the most attractive gold camp in Nevada. The ore opened up in this mine will run well up to \$150,000 in value - It is stocked for two and a half million shares and is owned by Idaho men principally - Men who are heavily interested in irrigation projects and in no sense mining men - Leasers have developed all the ore there is in the Bourne - They have spent over \$30,000 on it and on a most unsuccessful type of mill - The whole proposition is practically at a standstill and under the present methods is a failure in so far as getting the money out of the ^{is concerned} ore - The ore is an ideal free milling gold quartz and will average about \$15. per ton and is the finest ore in the world to treat with a stamp mill - In places along the vein the ore is 10 and 12 feet wide and so far the development work is of the most superficial kind - There are half a million shares in the treasury

and sixty percent of the remaining two million shares can be purchased for about 20¢ per share on time payments all of which a tin stamp mill would take care of as they fell due - Barring the first payment of ten per cent down the mine can be made to pay all the others by putting up an up-to-date stamp mill - The proposition would appeal to any mining man who wanted to mine and no such man would hesitate to take it up after he once saw it - The Bourne Pission - so called - extends through the Jarbridge District for nearly three miles and along its course are several properties being opened up - Wingfield bought the Success group for \$100,000 nearly a mile south of the Bourne mine and the intervening ground is equally as good - all this ore is high up on the mountain side from 500 to 1500 feet above the Jarbridge River which runs through the camp and in time will all be mined through long tunnels driven in from the level of the river - There is no new camp half so promising as this for big and continuous production - If you think it not likely to interest any of your own people you might mail my letter direct to Mr Henderson if you can obtain his address, for it embodies about all I can write to that gentleman and I will appreciate the favor very much - With my sincerest good wishes - I remain

My Dear Sir:--

I am herewith sending you by registered mail options for One Million, four hundred and ninety-eight Thousand (1,498,000.) shares of the stock of the North Star Mining and Milling Company--Limited---. Commonly known as the Bourne Mine of Jarbidge, at thirteen (13¢) Cents per share. Thirty Thousand (30,000) shares of this is treasury stock and the only treasury stock issued. There remains in the treasury Four hundred and seventy thousand (470,000) shares-- making in all one million nine hundred and sixty-eight thousand (1,968,000) shares. This stock is all held by the Boise City National Bank, of Boise, Idaho. Mr. B. F. Collins' option calls for the delivery of his stock by the First National Bank, of Idaho,, Boise, Idaho . I will have Mr. Collins make the change to the Boise City National Bank when I reach Jarbidge. See Buster Group on map of Jarbidge. I am sending you--joining North Star on south. This is an incorporated company of one million shares (1,000,000). There are three hundred thousand (300,000) shares in the treasury, and I can get about four hundred and fifty thousand (450,000) shares of the individual stock for about ten (10¢) cents per share.

Adjoining the Buster Group on the south and the Buster claim number three(3) on the southwest is the Stray Dog No. 1.

See option herewith enclosed. For the Last Chance Group No. 1 and No. 2, still to the south I will send you the option when I reach Twin Falls tomorrow evening, if it is completed. I had to send a man around to Elko, by the way of Ogden, to secure one signature, and he may not have returned yet. The Buckeye Group known on the map as "Buckeye and Stray Dog " No. 2 was sold to Spokane people for Two Hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) Dollars on payments extending over a period of eighteen months. Had your telegram of December 3rd reached me promptly I would have had the Buckeye Group for one hundred and fifty thousand (\$150,000) Dollars on long payments , with only three thousand (\$3,000.) Dollars down February 15th, 1912. The same people owned the Cold Spring Group of five claims joining the Buckeye and Last Chances on the south, and through which ground the Bourne lode runs. To keep anyone else from getting an option on it until February 1st, 1912 I got an option myself. The price is out of all reason and is two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) Dollars for a half million shares of individual stock. and four hundred and eighty thousand shares of treasury stock. Much excitement has been brought about in Jarbidge by the purchase by Wingfield of 51% of the Bluster Group stock on the basis of Three Hundred and fifty thousand (\$350,000.) Dollars for the whole property, and the taking over of the Buckeye Group

by Spokane people, who made a payment down. It may take me a week to complete and get in shape the options I am not sending you in this mail, and as the Bourne is larger than any other two properties in Jarbridge I will ask you to not delay making the necessary examination and to not wait until you receive the other option. It would be advisable for you to have your own assayer, the assay office at the Bourne mine can be arranged for. It is important that you proceed as quickly as possible, on the examination of the North Star or Bourne property, as we will be unable to get an extension of this option from the parties here after they learn of the deals already made in the camp. Please telegraph me by Western Union by the way of Twin Falls, when the gentleman who will make the examination starts west. I remain,
