SEEVER PROPERTY  
AT  
JEFFERSON CANON.

This property is situated in Jefferson Canon, about one mile northwest of the Kanrohat Group. The main vein follows a fault zone in rhyolite, and contains bunches and seams of high-grade silver ore, the vein as a whole, however, is too low grade to be mined at a profit.

A tunnel has been driven on the vein for a distance of several hundred feet, and from this several raises have been driven and a small amount of stoping has been done.

On the surface a considerable amount of drifting and stoping was done in the early days by Mexicans or Indians.

The rhyolite forming the hanging-wall of the vein contains several small stringers of high-grade ore at a considerable distance from the vein, and some work has been done on these.

The following samples were taken across the vein at various intervals where it was exposed in the tunnel:
