DEVELOPMENT: The location of the workings are on a conical shaped mountain about 500-600 feet high, with two large adits on both the east and west sides of the mountain. Numerous other workings are around the upper eastside.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: The country rocks are thin-bedded silver colored phyllites at the base of the mountain and quartzites and shales forming the conical mountain, with a pink fine-grained intrusive granite or felsic dike outcropping at the top. The slopes of the mountain exceed 45° in places with only one road serving the big lower adit on the east side. All of the other workings are served by very steep foot trails...even though the upper workings are extensive including; adits, shafts, inclines, open-stopps, trenches and prospects. Remnants of a tram including a drum and clutch are still in place.

The eastside of the Mountain is covered with white bull-quartz vein material that was mined from different workings and now forms a skree slope. A vein in shale cross-cuts the bedding plane near a small adit half way up the slope. Sample 2942 taken from the vein included white bull quartz with clots of galena and other sulfides.

Near the ridge a shaft and adjacent open-stope explored a N25E 50E vein that is intruding a light-pink fine-grained granite or felsic dike? The vein was sampled 2943 from the dump and the open stope. The vein was different in that it had more hydrothermal alteration along with breccia and had no galena. Large qtz veins intrude and cross-cut the sediments in a random fashion.
