Henrietta Unpatented Lode Mining Claim (sometimes known as Henreeta)

LOCATION

Kennedy Mining District, Pershing County, Nevada, about 30 miles south of Imlay.

GEOLOGY

A narrow vein varying from 18 inches to $l_{\mathbb{Z}}^{\frac{1}{2}}$ feet in width following bedding planes in schist. Values in gold, silver, and lead occur in small lenses.

DEVELOPMENT

The Henrietta vein is developed by four adit tunnels. The upper two adits are partially filled with debris; some oxidized mineralization is exposed. Principal mine workings are in the next lower or Henrietta adit tunnel, from which some stoping on several small lenses has been done both above and below the sill floor by means of raises and winzes. A crosscut adit tunnel about 195 feet vertically below the Henrietta adit tunnel cut the projected vein, which had a width of about $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet at this point.

Ore reserves: Several very small lenticular ore bedies have been developed in the Henrietta tunnel and winzes. Lenses above the tunnel level, however, have been stoped to their margins. The principal showings are in two small lenses in the 3 winges below the Henrietta tunnel sill floor. These lenses will probably produce some profitable ore, but the tonnage is conjectural.
